1. to letters without ascenders
2. to letters with ascenders
3. horizontal joins
4. horizontal joins to letters with ascenders

The **break letters** (letters that aren't joined **from**) are:

b g j p q x y z s

<h3>Pyramid Writing</h3> <p>"Pyramid write" your spelling words. <h3>ABC Order</h3> <p>First write your spelling words in a list. Be sure to underline your spelling words in your paragraph.</p> <p>You may type your story and email it to me if you like!</p>
