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Last week, we read the story 'The Ascension' based on Acts 1:6-11, and thought about ways in which we could continue Jesus' mission throughout our lives.

Today we are going to focus on:

The promise of the Holy Spirit based on Acts 2:1-18, 43 The Coming of the Holy Spirit.

Mary and the apostles were in Jerusalem living quietly together. They were uncertain as to what to do but wait. There were lots of people in the city at that time because it was the Jewish feast of Pentecost, that is thanksgiving for the harvest.
